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## H1N1 Niday Admission Screening Tool

*With support of the Ontario Chief Medical Officer of Health, the Ontario Perinatal Surveillance System (OPSS) is working in partnership with the Public Health Agency of Canada to collect information for one-year on H1N1-related exposures in pregnant women. There is a lack of information available to guide care for pregnant women and newborns, and given their status as high-risk groups, enhancing knowledge is a priority.*

From November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009 until October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2010, please ask these 3 questions to **ALL** women presenting for care around the time of birth. Enter the information obtained either from the admission history or antenatal record into the Niday database.

### Niday H1N1 Data Variables

1. Is there evidence (either from the maternal admission history and/or antenatal record) that the mother had laboratory-confirmed H1N1 influenza, had laboratory-confirmed seasonal influenza, and/or had an influenza-like illness (ILI)\* AT ANY TIME DURING THE PREGNANCY? Select **ONE**:

- No
- Lab-confirmed H1N1 influenza only
- Lab-confirmed seasonal influenza only
- ILI only
- Lab-confirmed H1N1 influenza **AND** ILI
- Lab-confirmed seasonal influenza **AND** ILI
- Lab-confirmed H1N1 influenza **AND** lab-confirmed seasonal influenza
- Lab-confirmed H1N1 influenza **AND** lab-confirmed seasonal influenza **AND** ILI
- Unknown

**\*Influenza-like illness (ILI) is defined as:**

- Acute onset of respiratory illness **and**
- Fever **and**
- Cough **and**
- One or more of the following symptoms:
  - sore throat **or**
  - sore joints **or**
  - sore muscles **or**
  - prostration/fatigue

**NOTE: ILI includes suspected H1N1 influenza or seasonal influenza that has not been confirmed by a laboratory test.**

2. Is there evidence (either from the maternal admission history and/or antenatal record) that the mother received antiviral medication, i.e., oseltamivir (Tamiflu) or zanamivir (Relenza), for treatment or prevention of H1N1 influenza or seasonal influenza AT ANY TIME DURING THE PREGNANCY? Select **ONE**:

- No
- Oseltamivir (Tamiflu) only
- Zanamivir (Relenza) only
- Oseltamivir (Tamiflu) **AND** Zanamivir (Relenza)
- Received other or unknown type of antiviral medication
- Unknown

3. Is there evidence (either from the maternal admission history and/or antenatal record) that the mother received vaccination for prevention of H1N1 influenza or seasonal influenza AT ANY TIME DURING THE PREGNANCY? Select **ONE**:

- No
- H1N1 vaccination only
- Seasonal influenza vaccination only
- H1N1 vaccination **AND** seasonal influenza vaccination
- Received influenza vaccination, but unsure what type
- Unknown
